

Motion was made by Brian Knight to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Jen Reinke.



There is MORE!



Wherever you are in your journey of growing in faith—growing in your relationship with God—God has MORE for you. A MORE that is better than what you are currently

experiencing! MORE peace. MORE comfort. MORE protection. MORE of whatever you need.

2020 was a difficult year in many ways.

Despite how it may feel, God is at work. He is intervening in your life and throughout His world. His faithful love is coming to the rescue. He is calming the storm.

True love came down at Christmas—God in human form, named Jesus (which means Savior). True love has captured us! Surrender your heart more and more to this Love and receive MORE of what He wants to have, know, and be!

My recommendation: for 2021, begin or renew your growth in faith through these three 'best practices':

Give thanks—praise and worship God

Be still—sit in silence with God: rest in Him

Engage with His Word—read, reflect on, study the Bible.

NOTE: these are all *PRACTICES*. That is, they must be practiced, done again and again, repeated (at least daily is the ideal). So...

Practices of gratitude (not just an attitude of gratitude)— actually engaging in moments of thanksgiving and praise as part of your regular, daily routine/practice.

Set a timer for 2 minutes or 5 minutes or 15 minutes and just sit in silence with God. Quiet your racing thoughts by repeating "Jesus" or a short Bible verse/ phrase.

Read from your own Bible. Even one verse a day counts! Then reflect on what you've read. Memorize it, perhaps. Ask God what he wants you to know from what you just read. Or dig deeper with a study Bible.

Start wherever you are and take even one small step toward growing in these 'best practices' for growing in faith until they become habit.

You will grow in faith! God does have MORE of himself that he wants you to experience!

You know what? I miss going to Faith Quake. And I miss going to

get coffee during our weekly meeting; sitting there, meeting with other people. Laughing. Discussing. Lamenting. Planning. And I really miss lock-ins that aren't happening or rescheduled until it is safe. I miss playing sardines and being stuck in the closet forever until they find me.

I miss community. There. I said it. As I have processed this desire for community, it has become clear to me that people handle not being in it differently.



A pastor I spoke with recently shared, "During this time of COVID, I believe the elderly will bounce back to their church community. They are resilient in their faith. I am not so sure, however, about our youth and emerging adults."

I wonder if we have laid a strong enough foundation of church community for our children. As we have tried to reevaluate and reorganize our activities for our youth, we pray that these kids are not floundering and losing their faith.

This is not just the job of the youth team however, and I am begging others to join in helping our youth. We can start simply by reaching out to those who might believe no one cares. Identify who the church's teens and young adults are and where they are. We began a great mentoring program last year that we have not been pushing because of trying to avoid extra contact, but it should be the concern of every member of the church (even without a named program) to make others feel worthy and valuable.

Could you send an encouraging card or note to a young person to introduce yourselves. (Who doesn't love getting mail today?)

Are you comfortable text messaging or video chatting? I know this is not in many adults comfort-zone, but today's young people recognize and are appreciative of our trying to communicate their "way" (For minors, make sure their parents are okay with this before reaching out).

Pray for the children, youth, and young adults in our church and community. Offer a prayer of protection amidst the lonely days of isolation. The power of prayer is such an important part of discipleship, and should not be neglected. And let them know that they are important enough to you to be prayed for. (What an
