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A Message from Pastor Janice



Dear Friends,

It's February already! 'Valentine's Day' is what many people think of when they think of February.

What comes to my mind when I think of February, however, is LENT.

Lent literally means *spring*, the season of new life and growth that follows winter. In the church calendar we use the word 'Lent' to

refer to a 40-day period of preparation for Easter. Easter—the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead! And so also, the celebration of our own re-birth, new life—resurrection!

This year during Lent (which starts Wednesday, February 17—Ash Wednesday), we will have mid-week worship services during which we will dig deep into the Parable of the Prodigal Son. Jesus tells this parable in Luke, Chapter 15—and it is a teaching that really declares the heart of the Christian Faith (and can also expose the ways that our hearts are not in full alignment with God's Heart).

The word *prodigal* means a) recklessly extravagant; b) having spent everything. Jesus' parable in Luke 15 in about **two** sons—the younger of whom does spend everything (and so is 'prodigal'). It is also about the elder son who is also 'lost' **AND** it is about *Our Prodigal (recklessly extravagant) God!*

I urge you to make mid-week worship and these teachings about Our Prodigal God a part of your faith life and growth this year. Growing in faith is possible! We can **define** *growing* in *faith* as increasing/ showing more of (that's 'growing') love of God and love of others (that's faith!)!

Keys for growing in faith are **personal spiritual practices** like worship, prayer and Bible engagement. Our mid-week Lenten Worship and teaching on The Prodigal God will equip and enable

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you in all 3 of those practices!

Annual Meeting Held

Thank you to all who attended the potluck and the Annual Meeting on Sunday, Jan. 31. Reports were given by Pastor Janice, Pastor Kay, Dave Schmidt, Carola Jobst, Cindy Fannin and Jackie Baldwin.

Bylaws A7.04, A7.05 and A8.05 were presented with changes and the changes were approved. The trustees will now total five (5) instead of seven (7) and the President will be a voting member.

A Constitution change to A17.02 was made that instead of a 5/7 or great affirmative vote of the trustees be made to amend the bylaws it will now be an affirmative vote of the Trustees.

Jackie Baldwin presented the 2020 year end budget and noted that we were in the black \$899.96. The 2021 budget was then presented. After reviewing the budget a motion was made to raise our First Fruits Giving to 15% and it was approved. We previously had been giving 10%. Lee Rambo motioned to split his monthly pay and give 1/2 of it to Tia as she is doing more each week. The motion carried on this also. The amended budget was approved.

Pete Fannin and Tom Anderson will be serving three year terms along with Jackie Baldwin, Sandy Krause and Jen Reinke. Baldwin and Krause terms will end in 2021 and Reinke's term will end in 2022.

If anyone would like to serve a three-year term on the Board of Trustees may contact one of the current members and let them know their wishes. Two people will be needed for 2021.

Thank you to Kelly Zillmer (President), Kris Zillmer (Secretary) and Brian Knight for serving their three year terms.

A Message from Pastor Kay

January is already over, and I pray your New Year is off to a good start. My family just celebrated the birth of our youngest granddaughter, Eleona Brook and are now preparing for our daughter's surgery as the next step in her cancer journey. And yet for so many reasons, I believe this year is going to be great. Jesus is certainly the most powerful reason for that. I am confident Jesus has plans to make 2021 a life-changing year for your family and mine.



But everything happens in Jesus' time which doesn't ever figure in how we put value on our time. Parents have approx. 936 weeks from the time their child is born until he or she graduates from high school. It goes by fast. The responsibility to shape a child's faith and character can seem overwhelming. If you are a parent, you have probably realized by now that you can't make a toddler share. Can't compel a teenager to make smart decisions. And you can't force a child to have faith. But there is something parents can do. They can make this week count. And then do it again, and again.

And when there is an opportunity, what do we say?? At some point you've likely found yourself in a discussion about the evidence for God's existence or the problem of evil, and found that you've run out of good responses. You've given a few solid explanations, which have always been perfectly adequate for you. But when they aren't enough for your doubtful teenager, you may become aggravated at your limitations that he/she has made public. That's when you may pull out one of these conversation stopping gems:

You just don't have enough faith. Are you really seeking the truth? You need to accept it; it's a mystery of God. Maybe you're just angry at God.

It's OK to admit you've reached the end of your confident knowledge base and that you'll seek others advice to take the conversation further or send them directly to one of our dedicated teachers who can also show them that having faith in God does not mean you have all the answers. Allow your teen the comfort of knowing that none of us ever reaches a point of having all the answers. Only God gets to make that claim. Live out the truth of

that now-famous D. T. Niles quote: "Evangelism is just one beggar showing another beggar where to find the bread."

We have been there. We can remember the uncertainty and questions we had as we worked on becoming mature Christians. We can possibly even remember the fear and anger of feeling unable to understand to God and the whys and hows. When your child throws a dismissive or angry statement your way, don't take the easy route of throwing something back. Instead, lean in, ask questions and explore the new worldview that has led to such a statement. Be honest, react with grace and be patient. Always make sure there's a bridge back home where he can bring his questions.

Parents have the most important job in building the kingdom, but Christ has given us a Christian community to fall back on, so we do not have to do it alone. Please continue to bring your children to church and feel free to approach any of the leaders or Sunday school teachers with questions or concerns. Let this village help you in raising your children!
