A Message from Pastor Janice



Dear friends in Christ. In these times of turmoil, conflict, and natural disasters around the

world (in addition to any turmoil and troubles in our own daily lives!), these words of Martin Luther's are insightful.

MARTIN LUTHER'S TEACHING **ON PSALM 27**

"The 27th psalm is a psalm of thanks. However, it also prays much and gives us comfort against false witnesses, who blaspheme without

any hesitation. For only entirely foolish saints would give a witness, bold and impudent, before God-from whom they have no command! Yet we see it daily: the more foolish and unlearned the people are, the more bold and audacious they are to preach and teach the whole world. No one knows anything; they alone know all. They prepare themselves to make war and revolt against the true saints and God-fearers. This psalm belongs in the Second and First Commandments and in the First and Second Petitions [of the Lord's Prayer]."

SUGGESTION:

- **Pray** this psalm (recite/read it out loud to God) several times (every day for 7 days or for a month or whatever you choose).
- **Meditate** on this psalm—read it slowly, meditatively, over and over. Reflect on whatever words or phrases catch your attention. Ask God what he wants you to know.

Psalm 27:1-14 Of David

[1] The Lord is my light and my salvation--whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life--of whom shall I be afraid? [2] When evil men advance against me to devour my flesh, when my enemies and my foes attack me, they will stumble and fall.

[3] Though an army besiege me, my heart will not fear; though war break out against me, even then will I be confident.

[4] One thing I ask of the Lord, this is what I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple.

[5] For in the day of trouble he will keep me safe in his dwelling; he will hide me in the shelter of his tabernacle and set me high upon a rock. (PASTOR continued on Page 3)

[6] Then my head will be exalted above the enemies who surround me; at his tabernacle will I sacrifice with shouts of joy; I will sing and make music to the Lord.

[7] Hear my voice when I call, O Lord; be merciful to me and answer me.

[8] My heart says of you, "Seek his face!" Your face, Lord, I will seek.

[9] Do not hide your face from me, do not turn your servant away in anger; you have been my helper. Do not reject me or forsake me, O God my Savior.

[10] Though my father and mother forsake me, the Lord will receive me.

[11] Teach me your way, O Lord; lead me in a straight path because of my oppressors.

[12] Do not turn me over to the desire of my foes, for false witnesses rise up against me, breathing out violence.

[13] I am still confident of this: I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.

[14] Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.

MARTIN LUTHER'S PRAYER for Psalm 27

Lord, our God, You are merciful and kind, true and faithful. Preserve us in Your Word, and guard Your Church against all oppressors and faithless leaders. Grant peace to our country, and wisdom to our government to protect right and truth, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Dear friends in Christ,

The question is being asked a lot lately...ow do we get the people back after COVID? It's not found in your regathering plan, your programs, or your curriculum. It's found in your relationship with the Lord. Let's look at Matthew 22:36-40.



³⁶ "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" ³⁷ Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with

all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Are you following this command? This should e at the heart of everything we do. Let's continually bear in mind that God has to be at the center of it all. *If not, we're on a slippery slope that will lead to short-term ministry and lack of growth every single time.*

Every time someone gets burned out and leaves a group or the church entirely the churches we serve suffers greatly for it. Here are **4 things YOU can do to work on the foundation and follow the Greatest Commandment.**

HAVE A REGULAR PRAYER TIME

We can't have a relationship with someone we're not even talking to. Prayer time is different for everyone, but before I get out of bed, I spend a few minutes thanking God for whatever he has given me for that day. Jesus told us how to pray in Matthew 6:9–13. Take a few minutes to look at that passage and try modeling your prayers after his.

GÉT INTO A BIBLE STUDY

Whether it's at home or at church, you need to get into God's Word. This is *separate* from your duties at church, it's for you personally. If you don't study separate from your duties at church, the Bible will quickly become a textbook.

GET A "PAUL" IN YOUR LIFE

Everyone needs a "Paul". The Apostle Paul was a spiritual leader for Timothy. You need someone in your corner that can point out what you're doing well and call you out when you're doing wrong. A good "Paul" will be there to mentor you, to pray for

you, and to check in on you.


GET A "BARNABAS" IN YOUR LIFE
