#### **BE INVOLVED**

### **LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF PARISH PROJECTS**

Soap (new and wrapped), Child Care Kits, blankets and quilts. At the request of LWR, we will not collect clothing for them. Purchasing clothing in their own countries is more helpful to the local economies.

#### **QUILTS**

A LWR quilt is special! It brings warmth on a cold night, shelter from the sun on a hot day. It becomes a bed, a room divider, a backpack to carry belongings, and at times even a home.

Ladies Aid members meet each Tuesday morning from 9 am-12 pm at church to assemble 60" x 80" quilts. Any size sheets (dark colored or patterned), including flannel, blankets (may be electric) and mattress pads are always needed for quilts. Large pieces of cotton fabric are always needed.

#### **CHILD CARE KITS**

In refugee camps, hospitals and villages around the world, gifts of layettes convey a warm welcome to newborns and their mothers. Include the following items in each layette, sizes 6-24 months:

- ♦ Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet).
  Onesies or sleepers may be cut off and serged/hemmed.
- ↑ Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52"square (36x36 good size)
- ♦ Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred. Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling t-shirts.
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a
- ♦ baby cap.
- ♦ Two bath size bars (4-5 oz) of gentle soap in original wrapping.
- ◊ Two diaper pins or large safety pins
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- ♦ Two pairs of socks
- A bolt of flannel can furnish a number of receiving blankets, diapers and gowns.

### **CHILD CARE KITS (continued)**

Good GENTLY used clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted for new ones. Sizes 6 to 24 months may be used. Sweaters may be knit or crocheted from leftover yarn. They may also be made from heavy double knits. Preferred styles have buttons or tie down fronts. Rummage sale finds are GREAT for this project but ask yourself if you would put these items on your own children before including in the Child Care Kits.

# SERVING GUIDELINES FOR FUNERALS DECEASED ST. PETER'S MEMBER:

If the family requests lunch to be served following the funerals, the following services will be provided:

The Funeral Committee will purchase and prepare hotdish, pickles, dinner rolls, butter, coffee, milk and cake. Should the family wish ham in the sandwiches and cheese on the table the family is asked to pay for these two items. The committee will purchase the ham and cheese but the family is charged for it.

Guidelines for donations: 0-80 people \$200.00

80+ people \$300.00 Ham and cheese extra

If the family of a member or non-member chooses to use a catering service, the Ladies Aid will charge a fee if asked to serve the food.

#### **DECEASED NON-MEMBER**

If the family would like a lunch served, the ladies will prepare the same menu. The cost of \$7 per plate for making and serving the meal will be billed to the family.
