





A Message from Pastor Janice

Dear Friends,



It's time! To immerse ourselves in the Bible!

The Bible is a great gift. The Creator of all things entered into our human story and spoke to us. He inspired people over many centuries to shape words into books that reveal his mind, bringing wisdom into our lives and light to our paths.

But God's biggest intention for the Bible is to invite us into its Story. What God wants for us more than anything else is that we make the Bible's great drama of restoration and new life the story of our lives, too.

The appropriate way to receive a gift like this is to come to know that Bible deeply, to lose ourselves in it precisely so that we can find ourselves in it. In other words, **we need to immerse ourselves in it**

- -to read God's words at length and without distraction,
- -to read with deeper historical and literary perspective, and
- -to read through the Bible with friends in a regular three-year rhythm.

Immerse: The Bible Reading Experience has been special designed for this purpose.

So we are going to encourage each member of St. Peter's to increase their engagement with the Bible, but joining together in *The Immerse Bible Reading Experience* starting in January, 2023.

We'll begin by reading the entire New Testament together in 8 weeks! The form/ format will **be more like a book club than a Bible study:** a few people meeting together in a comfortable setting to discuss a book they are all reading—the book just happening to be the Bible!

Immerse: The Reading Bible is a six-volume Bible created with one goal in mind: to provide the best reading experience possible. It restores the Bible's text to its natural literary form: stories look like stories, songs look like songs, and poetry looks like poetry. Rather than traditional chapters and verses, each book is formatted based on the natural literary structures the authors incorporated when the books were first composed. And it is available in paperback, large print, and audio versions, as well as an ebook.

CAN I USE THE BIBLE I ALREADY HAVE?

Using a different Bible for the community book-club experience would be difficult, since the reading plan uses page numbers to indicate each day's reading. It will also be difficult to follow the text in discussion groups since people reference passages by page numbers and not chapter or verse.

More importantly, the format matters to the experience. Removing the chapter and verse numbers and restoring the natural breaks and literary formats changes how you read. Presenting the text in a more familiar format, like other books we are accustomed to reading, encourages reading books as whole books, letters as entire letters, and poetry as poetry. It is what the authors originally intended.

CAN I JUST READ IT BY MYSELF WITHOUT BEING IN A GROUP?

Absolutely, and you will have a great experience reading an additive-free Bible. However, **community is a critical part of our spiritual growth**, and it's a vital part of the full Immerse experience. We are communal people, created by God to be in communion with Him and each other. That is why the books of the Bible were originally given to communities of people, and it's how the church for most of its history has interacted with Scripture. So community really matters.

A Message from Pastor Kay



With the New Year, we all make plans and try to fix what didn't work last year. As parents, we are probably preparing for whatever is next in the life of our children. We want to be ready. But there are periods during parenthood when we aren't sure what the future holds. The obstacles we face in parenting may include illness. behavioral issues, or developmental delays or only God knows what else. One moment we feel confident in their direction and the next moment we question what will become of our children. As loving God-fearing parents, we all experience these doubts.

A recent Christmas classic, Mary Did You Know by Mark Lowry and Buddy Greene, explores the perplexity of whether Mary fully grasped the task of being a mother to Jesus. The lyrics pose a series of questions: did Mary know Jesus would save our sons and daughters? Walk on water, heal the sick, be heaven's perfect lamb? That he would one day save all the nations? As a parent, this song resonates with me in the depths of my soul. Like Mary, I vividly remember treasuring quiet moments as I rocked my own children to sleep, not fully knowing what was to come - and those moments of sheer panic.

The song makes us wonder how we parent our children with so little information about their future. A closer look a Mary's parenting provides us a wonderful example of not fully knowing the weight of raising Jesus but trusting God in her times of uncertainty and suffering.

We wonder what Mary, who was merely a teenager, thought when an angel of the Lord came to visit, foretelling her miraculous pregnancy even though she was still a virgin and betrothed to Joseph. But she trusted all he said to be true, saying, "I am the Lord's servant." (Luke 1:38).

While Mary didn't know (but could probably guess) how her friends and family would react to her out-of-wedlock pregnancy, she trusted God. She went to visit Elizabeth who exclaimed, "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the child you will bear! Mary continued to enjoy time with Elizabeth until she returned home, trusting God with her pregnancy even in the uncertainty.

travel to Bethlehem to register for the census when she was nine months pregnant. With no place to stay, she gave birth to Jesus in a stable. Mary didn't know what would happen, but she trusted God for his provision even though she was in a stable surrounded by animals.

We wonder if Mary knew what Simeon meant when he said to her only eight days after Jesus' birth, "... a sword will pierce your own soul too" (Luke 2:35). Sometimes the answers are right in front of us, but God has not opened our eyes to see the full truth. Perhaps God is preparing our hearts for when the suffering and uncertainty arrives, as he was preparing Mary.

We wonder if Mary knew what Jesus' ministry would look like. After they attended the Feast of Passover, twelve-year-old Jesus went missing only to find him listening to the teachers and leaders. he said to Mary and Joseph "Why were you searching for me? Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?" (Luke 2:49-51).

When Mary stood by watching Jesus being crucified on the cross, we wonder if she knew Jesus would save us all in his death. As the song ponders whether Mary knew the complexities of the journey Jesus faced, Scripture is clear that she did know who He was but did not fully know all that He would face. Perhaps

Mary's faith as she raised Jesus provides us guidance as we parent our children in the known, not-so-known, and unknown. God promises us the Holy Spirit who guides us as we cross dark and murky waters while raising our children. Our Wonderful Counselor will help us navigate His truth and be our Comforter. When we treasure tender moments with our kids, even as we live in not-knowing, God prepares our hearts for later moments that might otherwise be too difficult to bear. We, like Mary, can trust God with our children even when we don't exactly know the outcome of every trial they will face.

As we begin the new year, I beg of all parents and grandparents, make Christ the center of your life and of your chil-

dren's lives. We do not know what the future holds, but we can trust that God has a plan and purpose for each of us. We need to trust Him. We need to teach our children to trust Him. We thank God for sending His Son Jesus to Mary and us. We thank God that He used her. Thank God that He is using us also.


