FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR JANICE



Dear friends,

THIS IS WORTH REPEATING!

We (St. Peter's) had a word from God several years ago: that we need to be a 'church on the move.' As leaders, the Elders and I have been seeking to understand how we can do this. One of the ways I see that we can do it is by moving "Out of the 4th Place." That's the title of a book by Matt Broweleit and Dudley Callison which posits that churches are operating in the wrong place in our society—in the 4th place.

The <u>first place</u> is the home—private life. The <u>second</u> <u>place</u> is work or school—productive life. The <u>third place</u> is where we go to unwind—informal public life. A favorite tavern or coffee shop or park. Church buildings don't fit in

any of these categories. Churches are part of the fourth place. And that's not a good thing for the church. It's actually quite a large problem.

If the third place is informal public life, then there must be a fourth category, formal public life—<u>the fourth place</u>. The fourth place, then, would include such institutions as country clubs, temples, stadiums, and yes, churches. They are fourth places, formal public institutions—*places of insiders and outsiders*, those with tickets and those without. If you have ever wondered why your church felt like a country club, this is likely the reason.

Why is being in the fourth place the wrong place for the church? For starters, because **Jesus intentionally moved church out of the fourth place**. Remember the Old Testament temple? It was a big building that people went to in order to worship God. The temple was a fourth place. Jesus changed that. Jesus is the temple. Remember, when he said, "Destroy this temple and I'll raise it in three days" (John 2:19), Jesus wasn't talking about a building. He was talking about his body. In other words, Jesus took something that used to be a fourth place, the physical temple, and he moved it right into the normal rhythms of his culture. **The temple became human and walked around the neighborhood.**



Why is church in the fourth place such a big problem? Here is why: the fourth place is

SUMMER! Yay or nay?

Do you remember when summer was relaxing? Most parents will say it depends on the day. When the kids are fighting for the 50th time that day. Or the floor you mopped at 10am is a mess by 10:20. OR you've got a collection of half-started projects because the morning was spent intervening in catastrophes...Where do you find that grace & rest Jesus promised?

It's clearly a new day when it comes to planning out our kids' summer. My memory may fail me, but I can't remember one time when I overheard my parents discussing which camps their three kids were going to attend, coordinating dates to ensure we had friends with us, and trying to decide what educational materials we should work through to be sure we didn't lag behind next year. God

forbid our tournament team calendars conflict with our family vacation.

Here's how it went in my house as a kid on the farm, and probably yours: Vacation Bible School in June. (**VBS is July 17-21 this year.**) That was the plan.

Somehow in spite of my parents' failure to orchestrate each and every second of our summer, we had a great time in just keeping it simple. Albeit, the bar was lower "back in the day." (Kool-Aid to cool off, Sun-In for that not-so natural highlighting, all topped off with a heavy dose of gluten-ridden cuisine). In the words of an esteemed '80s icon – "those were the best days of my life." Okay, maybe I'm exaggerating.

Yes, our kids love the camps and all the activities, no doubt. But they also love down time, and there are a limited number of summers you get to just be a kid. Limiting activities and allowing kids to "refresh" sounds terrific in practice, yet it's a recipe for disaster if we aren't careful and thoughtful. Nothing brought out my bad parenting like arguing kids, the goshdarn heat, and ungrateful attitudes repeatedly sounding the "I'm bored" mantra.

So I have tried to gather some thoughts on how to make our summers more purposeful. So here are a few ideas if you are looking down the barrel at June and feeling a bit intimidated

Serve Others - I was talking to a friend about what we thought Jesus would do with his summers: we concluded that he served others everywhere, all the time, wherever he went. Summer provides the time and opportunity for us to model this with our kids. It doesn't have to be complicated: take snacks to firemen, do random acts of kindness around town, make blessing bags for the homeless. One friend said she finds a way for her daughter to share her gift for music by coordinating with nursing homes to have her play the piano for the residents. Where can your child use their gifts and talents to serve others? A little creativity and intentionality goes a long way when it comes to serving and getting your kids involved.

Biblically Parent the Gaps - Find a topic to focus on and study biblically with the kids each summer. Summer often seems to reveal some heart issues with kids that need nurturing and correction. Often times it relates to how they treat each other and their attitudes. Summer is a great time to find a topical Bible study (age appropriate, of course), and work through it with your kids. A few ideas: entitlement, selfishness, salvation, self-esteem, self-control in thoughts and words . . . the ideas are endless. Memorizing scripture on fear, self-control or other struggles they may be facing is another great way to make a lasting impact.

Maximize Family Time - Finally, summer allows us the time to prioritize our families and get some old fashion bonding in. Whether your family likes to camp, read, travel, or simply

preaching messages to our world that we would never want to say with our mouths. Our mouths are preaching the greatest messages in the history of the world: reconciliation with God, restored community with each other, purpose in the world. Our forms, however, are often preaching the exact opposite messages: separation from God, separation from each other, separation from the world.

Remember, Jesus moved the church out of the temple—out of the fourth place. Unfortunately, the church moved back in. When did that happen? How did we move back into the fourth place? The short answer is that in fourth century Rome, Constantine helped to rebuild the temple of stone that Jesus had turned to flesh. When Constantine made Christianity the official religion of the Roman Empire, he rebuilt Christianity not as a living temple scattered throughout all of the cultures of the world, but instead as a place of its own religious culture. Rather than expressing the beauty and diversity of the cultures of the world, the church would express the culture of the fourth place.

I encourage you to reflect on this! How is God calling us to be a *church on the move?* And how might we move St. Peter's *out of the 4th place?*
