FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR KAY



Just three short months ago, I sat in a room with a team from Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Tomah: I was there to be open in heart to what God had for me, but as always toward the end of my interview with them, the conversation turned to my career aspirations. One of the team members asked me how long I could see myself being a youth pastor. My answer was simple and genuine: if I reached the age of sixty-five and had spent my entire ministry career working with students, God would have been far too good to me.

I really meant it. In fact, when I first began 20+ years ago, I loved it so much that I never wanted to do anything else. And when some well-meaning soul would ask me when I was going to move on from youth ministry (and become a "real"

pastor), I was usually upset at the question. I didn't see any reason to look forward to something else, because God had called me to work with youth.

Today, I find myself in a very unfamiliar position: I am no longer going to be a youth pastor. Even as I write this, I feel a twinge of sadness. I loved being a youth pastor. Not only was it a ton of fun, but God has been far too gracious to me to give me the privilege of seeing Him change the lives of countless teenagers and families through Jesus.

As I leave St. Peter's, I promise to always be an advocate in the church who reminds other influencers that teenagers matter to God. And I know there are so many at St. Peter's who are also this kind of advocate; the kind that helps the youth far from God with the good news that Jesus died for them. Use that influence in your community to grow God's kingdom; you don't need me.

I also promise to always be a mentor. I survived all these years in youth ministry because of the amazing God-fearing and God-loving mentors I had along the way. I surrounded myself with others in youth ministry to be able to tap into their resources and their experiences. I also made sure to be there for the kids; we have an important qualification that most people don't realize: we know what it's actually like to be a youth. There is not a single person in the family of St. Peter's who hasn't been young

once. I will always be a phone call away for a listening ear or a prayerful warrior. But you got this; you don't need me.

As I prepare to leave St. Peter's, there is a feeling of loss. But it isn't "Good-Bye". It is "I can't wait to hear/see what God does through all of you!" God is forever faithful. Lean on that; trust in Him! You don't need me.

Thank you all for the years of love and friendship. Our hearts will always be with the people here. Blessings always

I do believe God is calling me into mission with them as this next chapter of their congregation's life begins.

Paul opens his letter to the church at Philippi with these words: "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now." Through all the varied emotions I am currently feeling, I am definitely experiencing the joy Paul felt as he wrote to his beloved congregation. It is impossible for me to express how grateful I am to God for the privilege and pleasure of serving here at St. Peter's. I believe God has truly blessed our ministry together. My family and I have also been richly blessed through the loving, nurturing, and supportive family that is St. Peter's. The relationships we have formed have enriched our lives and allowed us to love and be loved in the most godly ways.

Transitions are difficult. Change sucks! But my phone will always be on, and if you are willing to drive, my door will be open. As it will be important for you all to learn and depend on the new way of doing things here, I am always willing to be a listening ear and prayerful heart.

As I said earlier, you all have truly been a blessing in my life and the life of my family. We will miss you dearly. Thank you for 25+ years of serving, laughing, crying, and doing God's work together. Thank you for sending us off with your blessing. Blessings always,

- 5. Prayer requests will be posted for four (4) weeks unless request is renewed by individual or immediate family member.
